Ahh-Choo! Art Connections

Introduce terms of foreground, midground and background. Identify which objects on each page are found in each.

Draw attention to action lines. This illustrator uses special lines and colors to show movement. How does a reader know which direction the germ is moving in each picture?

Draw attention to what's on the page, and what's not: The illustrator focuses on parts of characters' bodies to draw attention to the germ's travels. What is off 0the page in each image? How do you know?

Make layered pictures by cutting out different images from magazines and placing them on top of brightly colored backgrounds.

Combine media by using magazine cutouts, strips of tissue paper, and cut-out original drawings to create a new image.

Show action by drawing action lines around a figure. Make multiple copies of the same drawing. Ask the children to add action lines to show the character dancing, or falling, or jumping up.

Experiment with perspective by drawing the germ from different angles. Draw a picture of the germ looking down at you. Now, try drawing one of him sitting on a friend's nose. Now, try drawing him running away.
